### SIGNATURE PROGRAMS & EVENTS

#### 2023 CITIZEN OF THE YEAR AND ANNUAL DINNER

The Citizen of the Year and Annual Dinner event is our celebration of the Howell Area business community, non-profits, and individuals who went above and beyond in the past year. Held on February 2nd at Cleary University, we had a sold out event.

#### **HOWELL'S SUNDAY FARMERS' MARKET**

The weekly Howell Sunday Farmers' Market returns the first Sunday in May and runs every Sunday through October on State and Clinton streets. The market features the finest in locally grown produce, bedding plants, flowers, homemade goods, and crafts. The Market draws thousands of visitors downtown each Sunday for six months out of the year with an average of 27,000 visitors each season.

#### MICHIGAN CHALLENGE BALLOONFEST

The Howell Area Chamber of Commerce's biggest signature event is the Michigan Challenge Balloonfest, held every year during the last full weekend in June. The event consists of over 35 hot air balloons and their pilots competing for points. Five launches are scheduled throughout the weekend. In addition to the main attraction the event includes an open-air marketplace, a family fun tent, headline bands, live entertainment, a balloon glow, a pilot meet & greet, carnival, fireworks, and more. This festival alone had an estimated attendance of 80,000-100,000 people.

#### **BALLOONS & BREWS**

The Michigan Challenge Balloonfest, Balloons & Brews, back for its second year in Downtown Howell on State Street boasted an afternoon of beer tasting, food, games, and entertainment. The event had over 120 guests and 6 local breweries. The proceeds from this event support the Fantasy of Lights Parade (a program of the Howell Area Chamber of Commerce Foundation)

#### HOWELL CHAMBER GOLF CLASSIC

Completely sold out with 144 attendees, the Annual Chamber Golf Classic is a community tradition and opportunity to reconnect with other business professionals on the green.

#### SPARKLE & STRIVE

Annual Women's Leadership event offering the opportunity for women to come together to uplift, empower, celebrate, and elevate each other. This year's conversation brought mental health to the forefront and cultivated a space for awareness and acceptance. The event also featured pop-up shops, decadent desserts, wine and snacks for over 90 guests.

#### **FANTASY OF LIGHTS**

For almost 40 years, the Fantasy of Lights Parade, hosted by the Howell Area Chamber of Commerce Foundation, has served as the official kick-off to the holiday season in Howell. A cherished holiday tradition for many families, the parade unfolds as the lights dim. Parade spectators warm-up with vendor concessions and hot beverages as they witness beautifully lit floats gliding down Grand River, accompanied by local marching bands, first responders, special guests, and the big guy himself – Santa!

Other activities include shopping with local merchants, refreshments, live entertainment, and visits with Santa and his Reindeer. The Fantasy 5K race and one-mile family fun walk is one-of-a-kind. Runners don their favorite holiday apparel, costumes, and lights to race along the parade route. The atmosphere is fun and exciting with a crowd on each side of Grand River cheering on our festive racers. The event has an average attendance of 35,000.



### **ECONOMIC & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT**

The Howell Area Chamber of Commerce has placed a strong emphasis on Economic and Workforce Development within Livingston County. In the current year, the Chamber has introduced on-site training opportunities for both employers and employees.

### LIVINGSTON BUSINESS HUB

The Howell Area Chamber of Commerce, in partnership with Ann Arbor SPARK, secured the MEDC Business HUB Grant to establish an Innovation Center and Business Hub, positioning Livingston County and the Howell Chamber as a leader in business support services. This multifaceted initiative, envisioned in late 2020, addresses the evolving needs of businesses and entrepreneurs. The Livingston Business HUB is the reimagined use of the existing chamber space. The renovated facility features co-working spaces, conference rooms, and office suites, fostering growth and learning. Through the grant, the Chamber will be able to outfit the space with updated technology, and furnishings, and provide programming. The HUB grant will support business training, upskilling and growth for the next three years.







Beyond the walls of our physical space, the Chamber is advancing economic development in Livingston County through key partnerships with the following organizations:

- Economic Development Council of Livingston County
- Livingston County Convention and Visitor Bureau
- Howell Main Street and DDA
- Housing Catalysts, Community Catalysts
- Livingston County Transportation Coalition Steering Committee

In addition to business attraction, transportation, and housing the chamber's large community events attract roughly 142 thousand visitors to the region each season to shop, dine, play, and stay locally.





### CATALYTIC LEADERSHIP

Change does not happen overnight, and we work hard at local, regional, and state levels to be a voice for business. We foster realationships throughout the year and support iniatiatives that support our business and community.

### LOCAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

Collaboration begins at home and making a difference in our local city and county government. This past year, the Chamber of Commerce has made the priorities of the business community heard in various ways. Some specific examples include:

- Attended Michigan Chamber Day in Lansing and met with Senator Lana Theis.
- Met with Fowlerville-based businesses, Ann Arbor SPARK, and LETS to advocate for Howell connections to MTA bus routes for businesses to tap into the Flint labor market.
- Held County Commissioner Meet & Greet Breakfast with members discussing their roles and broadband expansion plans in Livingston County along with ARPA funding allocation.
- Attended a presentation from Howell Superintendent Erin MacGregor to support the 2023 Bond Proposal for Howell Public Schools
- Held Coffee, Council, and Candidates to provide opportunities for members to meet our local elected and appointed officials and candidates.
- Chamber staff attended the Livingston County Convention and Visitor Bureau's Partner Luncheon. In addition to the Luncheon throughout 2023 all chamber staff became Certified Tourism Ambassadors for Livingston County.
- Attended the Economic Development Council of Livingston County Annual Dinner Event and received the Resilience award for the launch of the Livingston Business HUB.
